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The main emphasis of the journal is based on original research, analytical reviews of research and scholarly case studies. Submissions are welcome from authors in disciplines serving child development or mental health. Each submitted paper is reviewed by experts in the field of the paper's content. In order to be published, a paper must conform to professional standards of the disciplines identified with its content.

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Details of the submission and review process can be found at www.ricd.go.th/cdmh. The editor and editorial board oversee manuscript reviews. Once a manuscript is submitted, an editor is assigned, and this editor makes the peer reviewer assignments. The entire process ordinarily takes 6 months, and revisions are often requested.

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1. The preferred length of manuscripts is 20 typed pages or less, but a somewhat greater length may be accepted, depending on the complexity and importance of the research.
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 - 2) Authors, including first name, middle initial, and last name along with highest academic degree(s).

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4. Key words should be included. They are useful as a tool when researching for paper information from journals.

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7. Results: Present your results in logical sequence in the text, tables, and illustrations, giving the main or most important findings first. Tables and figures should each be numbered consecutively.

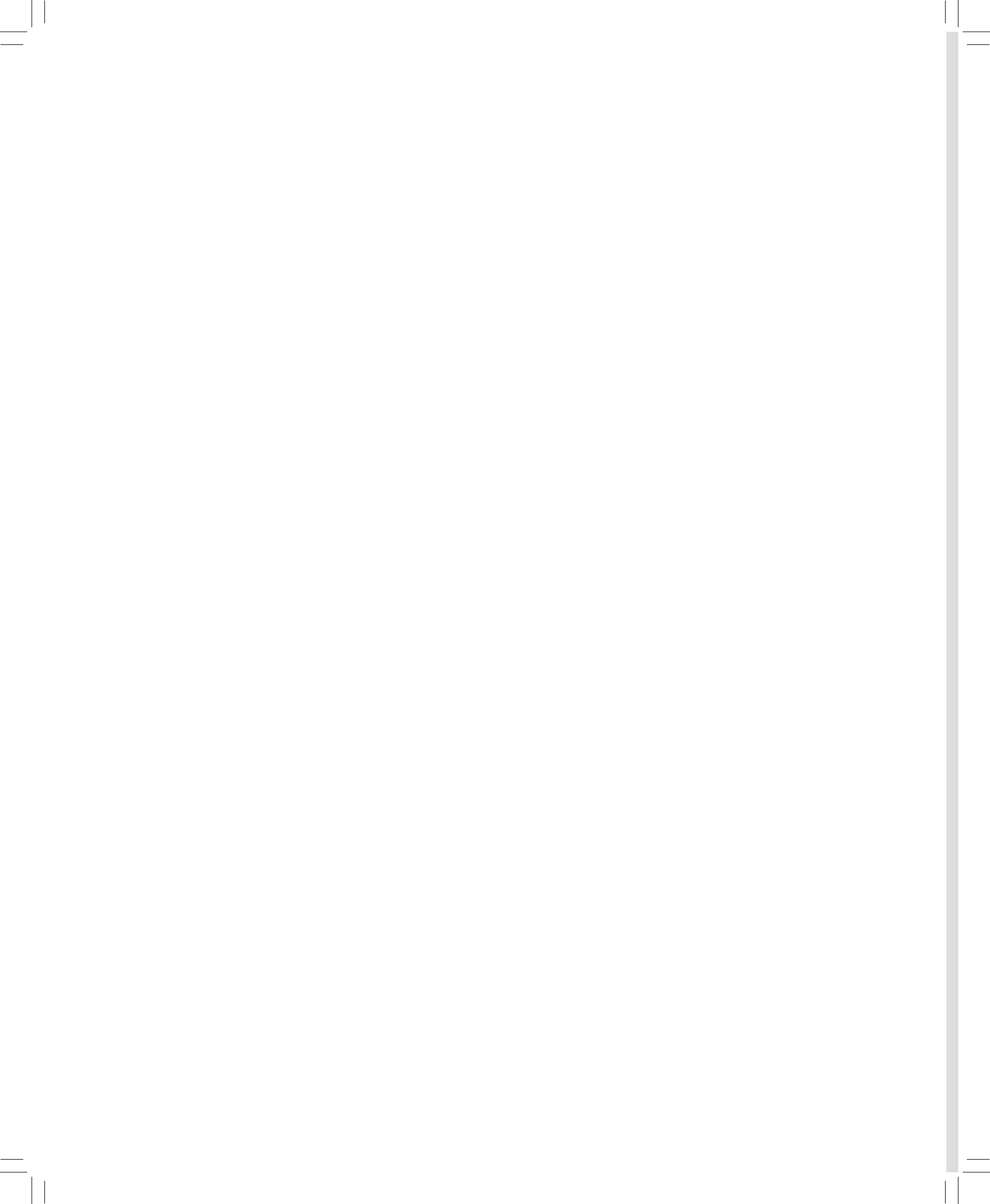
8. Discussion: Emphasize the new and important aspects of the study and the conclusions that follow from them.
